3. Inactive Catholics
4. Catholic Children
5. Other Christians
6. Non-Christians

	<p>4. To our children, Evangelization is: A call to be formed into disciples through the family's faith life and religious education.</p>

	<p>5. To other Christians, Evangelization is: A call to the fullness of the Catholic faith.</p>

	<p>6. To non-Christians, Evangelization is: A call to conversion to know Christ Jesus and thus experience a change to new life with Christ and His Church.</p>

	<p>3 Components:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Witness (Lives of holiness). 2. Word (Sharing the Gospel). 3. Service (Ministry of charity).

	<p>Our vision flows from the Bishops' National Plan and Strategy for Catholic Evangelization in the United States, <i>Go and Make Disciples</i>.</p> <p>Their 3 Goals are ...</p>

	GOAL 1
	<p>To bring about in all Catholics such an enthusiasm for their faith that, in living their faith in Jesus, they freely share it with others.</p>

	GOAL 2
	<p>To invite all people in the United States, whatever their social or cultural background, to hear the message of salvation in Jesus Christ so they may come to join us in the fullness of the Catholic faith.</p>

	GOAL 3
	<p>To foster Gospel values in our society, promoting the dignity of the human person, the importance of the family, and the common good of our society, so that our nation may continue to be transformed by the saving power of Jesus Christ.</p>

	Our Philosophy
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Approach evangelization as a <i>lifestyle</i> rather than as a program. ■ Create <i>evangelizers</i> rather than new evangelization techniques. ■ Root evangelization in <i>interior conversion</i> through <i>a personal relationship with Jesus Christ</i>.

	Our Spirituality
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Love: "<i>The love of Christ compels us.</i>" (2 COR. 5:14-15) 2. Holy Spirit: Being docile to and guided by the Holy Spirit. 3. Fervor: Undaunted and joy-filled witness.

	IMPLEMENTING OUR VISION

	Our Objectives
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Form lay leadership for effective evangelization. 2. Assist parishes in incorporating evangelization concepts within already existing programs; ex. RCIA, adult faith formation, Christian service. 3. Equip parishes with the tools and methodology necessary to create parishes in which evangelization is a vital component.

	Our Approach
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Meet with parish leadership. 2. A 3-day parish mission. 3. 8-week formation sessions. 4. Establish evangelization committee. 5. 6 Months consultation (or more).

	STEP 1 Meet with Parish Leadership
	<p>The Evangelization Team meets with the parish leadership (pastor, staff, parish council and the 4 commissions) to set forth the archdiocesan Strategic Plan of Evangelization: <i>You Shall Be My Witnesses</i>.</p>

	STEP 2 3-Day Parish Mission
	<p>The Evangelization Team will hold a 3-day parish mission, the goal of which is to (1) raise awareness of the Church's essential mission and (2) enkindle the hearts of the faithful to fully embrace this call to evangelization.</p>

	STEP 3 8-Week Formation Sessions
	<p>The 8-week formation sessions are designed for the integral formation of lay evangelists:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Instructive: Education in basic evangelization principles, understanding the content of the Gospel and relevant Church documents. 2. Formative: Practicing, sharing, and partaking in evangelization exercises.

8 Formation Session Topics

1. Who Is Jesus?
2. The Call to Holiness & Ongoing Conversion
3. The Call to Discipleship
4. Catholic Evangelization
5. The Role of the Holy Spirit & Prayer
6. Sharing Our Faith & Using Sacred Scripture
7. Listening with Compassionate Hearts & The Call to Love
8. Becoming a Welcoming Parish

STEP 4 Establishing Evangelization Committee

The Evangelization Team will assist the parish leadership in discerning and establishing an Evangelization Committee, consisting of active Catholics with a real enthusiasm for their faith and the ability to draw people into the love of Jesus and the Catholic way of life.

Forming the committee will include...

- Discernment of gifts
- Diversity of membership
- Availability

STEP 5 Ongoing Consultation

One member of the Evangelization Team will be assigned as the consultant to the parish for 6 months (or more) to assist parish leadership and the Evangelization Committee in developing and implementing their evangelization plan.
